## **Bulletin 3: RADIO MICROPHONES**

The Help & Advice Group was set up by Synod in 2009, to support local churches in being informed and effective in their life and mission. The Group is made up of five members of local churches, together with administrative support from the Trust Officer. Where readers are directed to web-based resources, the Synod Office is willing to respond to reasonable requests for printed out information for readers without web access, although they may find it more satisfactory to follow up their interest through their local library's web access.

## **Radio Microphones**

With the last of the analogue television transmitters due to be switched off during 2012, Ofcom has decided to reorganise VHF/UHF bands.

As radio microphones use frequencies within these bands, any changes could affect their use. At present, it does not appear that the unregulated low bands VHF 173-175 MHz will be affected. The regulated VHF band whose frequencies are 211-217 MHz is to be reallocated to 209-210 MHz. The regulated UHF band 854-862 MHz is to be cleared, and it is proposed to reallocate it to 607-613 MHz. The unregulated UHF band 863-865 MHz could remain unchanged.

As most churches will be using the unregulated frequencies, they should be able to continue using their radio microphones without any problem. To use radio microphones within the regulated frequencies, a licence must be obtained from the local authority.
