# \*National Minimum Wage

The annual rate increase on 1 October will bring the adult rate to £6.08 per hour:

### \*Health & Safety Law Poster

Churches with employees should already be aware of the legal requirement to display a poster in prescribed form on the premises. #### \*Internet Cookies

Churches with websites need to check information stored on visitors, called "cookies", as a result of an amendment to the EU Directive on Privacy and Electronic Communications, which came into force on 25 May 2011. If you use cookies, then you need to obtain users' consent. Further advice can be obtained from the Information Commissioner's Office:
