# **Bulletin 10: GENERAL UPDATE**

This month's general update includes brief details of two legal requirements (marked with an asterisk\*) and three other items which may be of interest. Web links are provided for those wishing to follow up these items further.

#### \*Accident Books

For data protection reasons, modern accident books provide for entries to be removed from the book and stored securely. The Health & Safety Executive and others produce accident books that comply with this requirement. ### **Diamond Jubilee Celebrations**

Churches wishing to hold events or conduct other activities in commemoration of the Queen's diamond jubilee should note that special permission is needed to use the terms "Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee", "Queen Elizabeth Diamond Jubilee" or "The Queen's Diamond Jubilee", but blanket approval is given for the plain use of "Diamond Jubilee" or simply "Jubilee". # **Insurance for Ecumenical Meetings**

Churches Together in England have advised that occasional joint events with other churches can be covered under the host church's insurance, provided that it is minuted that they are taking the insurance risk as host for the event. Local Churches Together groups that have a regular programme of events are advised to obtain their own insurance cover. CTE advises that suitable policies are offered by three insurers:

A petition has been set up calling on the Government to amend the Scrap Metal Merchants Act 1964 to prohibit cash transactions by merchants.
