Bulletin 11: CIVIL PARTNERSHIPS

The Marriages and Civil Partnerships (Approved Premises) (Amendment) Regulations 2011

New Government regulations came into force on 5 December 2011, which for the first time give the option for places of worship to offer non-religious civil partnership ceremonies for same-sex couples: www.legislation.gov.uk/uksi/2011/2661/pdfs/uksi_20112661_en.pdf.

The regulations are permissive in that they allow this option, which previously was not legally permitted.

Each religious denomination has its own consent procedure. In the case of the United Reformed Church, no applications may be made to local authority register offices to register local churches as approved premises for civil partnership ceremonies until General Assembly has given consent on behalf of the denomination as a whole. General Assembly next meets on 6-9 July 2012, and at this stage it is not known what decision will be reached.

Local churches that meet in properties belonging to other denominations or in local ecumenical partnerships would need to wait until **all** the parent denominations had given their consent.

Churches that are interested in registering as approved premises for this purpose should in the first instance contact Synod Office for advice **after July 2012**.
