Bulletin 33: CHARITY REGISTRATION

The Help & Advice Group was set up by Synod in 2009, to support local churches in being informed and effective in their life and mission. The Group is made up of four members of local churches, together with administrative support from the Trust Officer. Where readers are directed to web-based resources, the Synod Office is willing to respond to reasonable requests for printed out information for readers without web access, although they may find it more satisfactory to follow up their interest through their local library's web access.

Charity Registration

As noted in bulletins 16 and 21, churches with gross annual income over £100,000 should register with the Charity Commission. The majority of churches remain excepted charities under the Charities (Exception from Registration) (Amendment) Regulations 2014, so are not required to have a registered charity number until 31 March 2021. It is expected that medium-sized churches will be required to register after that time, although the Commission may possibly encourage voluntary registration in phases during the next 7 years.

In the meantime, when asked for a charity number, churches should explain that they have charity status but are not required to have a number, by the Charities (Exception from Registration) (Amendment) Regulations 2014.
