Church Grounds and Graveyards

Caring for God's Acre is a charitable organisation with a mission to champion the conservation of churchyards and burial grounds across the British Isles.

Their website, www.caringforgodsacre.org.uk, has helpful resources, including a downloadable action pack, with advice about how to involve people in a project, creating havens for wildlife, raising awareness of history, and managing churchyards. There is also a model risk assessment form, health and safety guidelines, and some short videos.

This is worth a look if your church has land around it, even if there are no graves.

Caring for God's Acre also holds occasional conferences and training events, although these tend to be in the south.
