

The Management Group has grown in number and we look forward to benefitting from the wider range of skills and experience. In this Jubilee year and in the week which concludes with the Queen's Jubilee celebrations, it seems a happy coincidence that Ruth's theme was inspired by words in the Queen's Christmas Message when she quoted from that much-loved Christmas hymn, "O, Little Town of Bethlehem".
