Gift Aid

HMRC has updated its detailed guidance. In chapter 3, section 3.4.5 clarifies that a donation must be a payment of a sum of money. Donations made by an individual waiving a refund or a loan repayment due from a charity, can be considered a donation of a sum of money where there is a clear agreement to cancel a loan or not accept a refund.
